## **SMSSD Board Meeting Minutes**

Board Members in attendance: Craig Godwin, Don Hunter, Trent Andersen, Beca Mark, and Ferris Taylor

Meeting called to Order: 7:05 PM by Craig Godwin, as Board Chair and a welcome was given to those on Zoom.

Invocation: Ferris Taylor

## Agenda was announced and reviewed - These are Summary Minutes:

- 1) Awarding Bid for Thad's Peak Well Project Underground 30,000-gallon storage tank, site work for new fill station, and ability to fill pumper trucks and helicopter pumpkins for fire suppression on the mountain.
  - a) A Letter of Recommendation from Hansen Allen & Luce, Inc, the SMSSD Engineers, on the Thad's Peak Well project and bids received was read and shared electronically with the board and participants (See Attachment A).
  - b) Discussion and analysis of the three bids (Dunn Right Construction, LLC, Dale Cox Contracting, and Patriot Construction) was thorough and extensive.
  - c) Each Bidder was required to list 3 similar projects in the last 5 years, with a minimum of 1 water storage tank project and 2 drinking water system installations.
  - d) Dunn Right Construction was the lowest bid, but did not list water storage tank experience, other than the Dunn Right Construction foreman's experience, which was with a prior construction company.
  - e) The second lowest bid was Dale Cox Contracting, which met all the requirements.
  - f) Line-item comparisons were looked at across 15 components of the two qualified bids.

- g) Other associated topics of discussion included:
  - i) The timeframe for decision As soon as possible because the project needs to be completed before December 31, 2024 (in reality, before snow is on the mountain).
  - ii) How is the project to be paid for 75% of the total cost will be a grant from the Central Utah Valley Water Conservation District with County approval. The remaining 25% will be financed by the approved restructuring of the State of Utah SMSSD Bond at 2.09% vs 2.5%. Overall, the payments will be lower with an extended timeframe.
  - iii) Will SMR members have a vote on the project or bond The Public Hearings on both the Thad's Peak project and the restructuring of the SMSSD Bond have already taken place. Attendee input and questions were welcomed, shared and acknowledged.
  - iv) If Sanpete County and CUVW have remaining grant money, what are the other Phases of this "shovel-ready" project Phases 1 and 2 were combined for this bid. Phase 3 would be a winterized building at Thad's Peak for year around water access and a card reader to track usage. Phase 4 would be a winterized building, card reader, and a larger fill hose for year-around access at the lower well fill station.
  - v) Kim Hansen asked for future discussions between SMR and SMSSD Boards on projects beyond the Master Water Plan.
- h) After discussion and consideration, a request for a motion was made.
  - i) Beca Mark made a motion to accept the Dale Cox Construction bid (which met all the required bidder qualifications).
  - ii) Don Hunter seconded that motion.
  - iii) The Board voted as follows:
    - (1) Criag Godwin Yes
    - (2) Beca Mark Yes
    - (3) Don Hunter Yes
    - (4) Trent Andersen Yes, primarily given the 75% grant money
    - (5) Ferris Taylor Yes
- 2) Discussion on Impact Fees for lot B-104.
  - a) Consideration of waiving the Impact Fee for B-104 for the following reasons:
    - i) The Lot already has a water meter and hook up.
    - ii) The building is not to be a habitable structure just a hose bib for their RV.
    - iii) SMR will revise the HOA Approval Form to include an SMSSD "will serve" confirmation letter Trent Andersen to follow up on updating the SMR HOA form.
    - iv) It was shared that Sanpete County is in the process of updating their approval process to also require a copy of the SMSSD "will serve" letter for permit approvals.
    - v) SMSSD will want all building permit requests with a **habitable structure** to include a notice from SMSSD that a "will serve" letter has been issued.
- 3) Report from SMR/SMSSD Liaison Trent Andersen
  - a) Trent Andersen asked for confirmation on the bid approval process that SMR members do not vote on approving the financials on the Thad's Peak project nor the restructuring

- of the State of Utah Bond for SMSSD's portion of the cost. Public hearings were held on both issues, as noted in paragraph 1(g)(iii) above and documented in prior minutes.
- b) Trent Andersen recalled that SMSSD Attorney Craig Smith agreed that the Impact Fee language may be refined, and the SMSSD Board can consider changes at any time.
  - i) Craig Godwin indicated that it will be added to a future board meeting agenda for discussion.
- c) Trent Andersen asked about the status of 2023 State Audit written results are expected in the next few weeks.
- d) Jake Blaney and Roy Fox have compared SMR monthly dues with SMSSD water billing.
  - i) Roy will email the list of differences (list provided to Trent Andersen in the meeting).
  - ii) All but one seems to relate to SMSSD not charging for the combined lots on the SMR subdivision plat and as recorded by Sanpete County in the SMR subdivision map.
  - iii) The exception is the Overlook Lot (K47) owned by Jack Nielsen, with an agreement to waive water fees and dues on J55A in exchange for SMR member and public access to K47.
- 4) A booster pump from the lower 55,000-gallon tank up to the upper 255,000-gallon tank needs to be replaced. Bids have been obtained from two vendors MountainLand at \$13,389 and Lanquest at \$10,979.40.
  - a) Don Hunter noted that a complete pump rebuild is sometimes more costly than a new pump, but Roy will explore rebuilding the old pump to possibly have as a backup.
  - b) Motion was requested, per purchasing policy, for approval to purchase the pump from Lanquest in the amount of \$10,979.40.
    - i) Ferris Taylor made the motion to purchase the new pump.
    - ii) Don Hunter seconded the motion.
    - iii) The SMSSD Board vote was unanimous to approve the motion.
- 5) For the SMSSD Board and the SMR Board present, Roy Fox and Ferris Taylor have been drafting SMSSD bylaws, as requested by the Sanpete County Commissioners and County Attorney.
  - a) Watch for an email request to review and edit the drafted SMSSD Bylaws.
- 6) Craig Godwin indicated that a SMSSD in-person Board Meeting was being planned after Thad's Peak construction starts, so watch for an inquiry as to calendar availability.
- 7) Motion to Adjourn was made by Don Hunter, seconded by Ferris Taylor.
  - a) The motion to adjourn was unanimously approved by the Board.
- 8) The SMSSD Board Meeting was adjourned at 8:45 pm on May 28, 2024.

The Board and all attendees were thanked for their participation in the meeting, the open discussion, and especially the approval of the Thad's Peak Phase 1 and 2 fill station buildouts.

Re: Thad's Peak Tank - Recommendation for Award

Dear Mr. Fox:

We have reviewed the bids for the Thad's Peak Tank project and recommend that the project be awarded to Dale Cox Contracting.

SMSSD received a total of 3 bids for the Thad's Peak Tank project. For your reference we have attached a copy of the Bid Tabulation. Dunn Right Construction, LLC submitted a bid price of \$598,720.00. Dale Cox Contracting submitted a bid price of \$649,233.00. Patriot Construction submitted a bid price of \$715,929.40.

As part of the bid submittal, each contractor was required to list a minimum of three similar projects completed within the last five years, including at least one water storage tank, and at least two for drinking water systems. The submission by Dunn Right Construction included two projects completed by Dunn Right Construction, neither of which included a water tank. Other experience provided occurred while the current owner of Dunn Right Construction was working as a foreman for other construction companies. Because requirements for previous experience were not met, the submittal from Dunn Right Construction is considered to be non-responsive.

The lowest responsive bidder is Dale Cox Contracting. Dale Cox Contracting possesses the required Utah Contractors License (245701-5501) to perform this work and their license is in good standing with the State of Utah. Their proposed excavation and piping subcontractor, Terry R Brotherson Excavating (license 5075476-5501) also has a license in good standing.

We evaluated the information provided with their bid, including experience and references, and they appear to have the appropriate previous experience to complete a job of this complexity. Dale Cox Contracting has a good reputation for completing quality work on water storage tanks in Utah.
