The 2025 Survey results are a bit more insightful when compared to the attached 2018 Upper Mountain and Birch Creek Member survey results, which unfortunately were not broken out by area. Differences from the 2025 results, combined for the two areas include:

Mailed Mountain and Birch Creek surveys increased from 344 to 506 since 2018.

The percentage response rate dropped from 40% to 31.4%. (Possibly because the Thad's Peak Project satisfied the desire for year-round access to water there.)

The percentage of seasonal/recreational lot owners who "agreed" that "The existing water arrangements provided in the upper mountain and birch creek areas meet my needs," increased from 60% in 2018 to 69.2% for 2025 - a positive change

The ranking of the most important priorities stayed the same (the Thad's Peak project was not on the survey, due to completion), although the difference between fire suppression and seasonal culinary water narrowed from 56 points to 12 points.

The gap between the top two priorities and year-round culinary water in the Birch Creek area increased by 11 points and is a distant third - similar to the 2018 results.

In contrast, (although only represented by 26.4% of Birch Creek), the percentage of respondents who "agreed" to "I would support a substantial rate increase in water rates per month for year-round access to culinary water at my lot" jumped from 16% in 2018 to 32.1% in

The comments received (almost 50% of lot owners), as categorized and summarized below, represent wide and diverse opinions. SMSSD finds the comments helpful, as they provide color to the survey results and highlight additional perspectives for consideration.
